

Upper School Residential Trip to Fairthorne Manor Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> – Friday 16<sup>th</sup> June 2023 (2 days and 1 night)

We are organising a residential trip to Fairthorne Manner in Southampton for our upper school students. We have reserved 8 places and need to find out how many of you would like your son/daughter to take part in this opportunity. Please be aware we will need to draw names from a hat if demand is higher than the reservation booked.

The accommodation is purpose built, all meals are provided and throughout their stay students will take part in a wide range of activities which may include: Kayaking, Campfire, Ariel runway, jumping pillow, obstacle course

This is a fantastic opportunity for our young people on all levels. This trip is supported by our staff, who happily give their time beyond their paid contracts because they see first-hand how much pleasure our young people get from these experiences.

In order for this trip to go ahead we need to ask for a voluntary contribution of £160 per student. Parents will be encouraged to use Eduspot to make regular payments. Further details of the payment plan will be given if your child takes part in the residential.

If you are in receipt of any of the benefits listed at the foot of this letter we would request that a voluntary contribution of the full cost of this trip is paid.
