Music has been a real success where we have been trying out different instruments and taking part in solo performances to the class. The keyboards were a real hit where everyone made different sounds for us all to enjoy.



We will have more sessions in the spring and summer term and we look forward to seeing you all then.






# Explorers- Focus On Pelicans
